I. <u>Discussion of 2nd Annual UNC Latino conference @ Wilmington in September</u>

Yvette Huet, Sam Lopez, Cathy Blat, Benny Andres attended the conference with their families.

III. Yvette's meeting with the Chancellor and the diversity report

Yvette Huet, representing Caucus, accompanied President of the African and African-American Faculty Staff Caucus met Chancellor's staff to review diversity report on Chancellor's website.

- Of note was a campus-wide plan of access and inclusion by Chancellor's Advisory Committee.
- Discussion of the Multicultural Resource Center and Chancellor's Diversity Fund. Since 2007, some 100 grants (45 speakers), mostly from CLAS, yet few proposals from staff. Mini grants are \$1,000 and regular grants are \$5,000.
- President Yvette Huet reported undergraduate and graduate enrollment trends of underrepresented minorities are 30.67% UNCC minorities (17% Black; 6% Latino). UNC Greensboro has largest underrepresented minority and UNCC is in 2nd place.
- Data reveal 17% UNCC faculty are underrepresented minorities.
- Chancellor initiative to increase hiring of underrepresented faculty, include Diversity Institute and salary inequities.
