Huet Sí Se Puede Scholarship. I am pleased to invite you to help select our Yvette M. Huet Sí Se Puede Scholarship recipient for 2025.

Please complete this form (https://forms.gle/RxvHaJ3RkgV1PY7n6) by March 24th if you are interested in participating as a Scholarship Reviewer, and if you have any questions or concerns, feel free to reach out. I will be in contact the first week of April with the reviewers.

As a reviewer, you will be evaluating essays and assign scores using a provided rubric and a spreadsheet. Reviews are completed online. We anticipate that each reviewer assesses 3–12 essays, requiring about 2–4 hours (pending the final number of applicants and reviewers). While reviewers work independently, at least one other person evaluates the same set of applications, allowing for score comparison at the end.

Below is the projected timeline for the review process:

- April 1: Scholarship application closes
- Second week of April (TBD): Zoom meeting to go over the process
- April 10: Reviewers gain access to assigned essays and rubric
- April 24: Deadline for completed reviews and scoresheets
